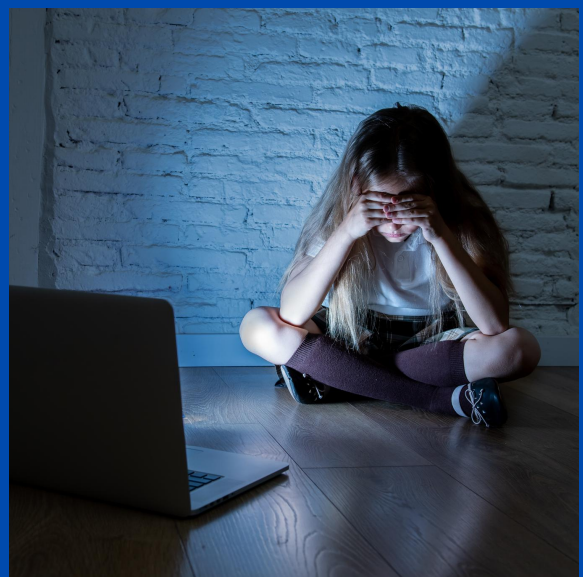
STOP CYBERBULLYING

Top six tips
